### **Election Panel**

The Orange County Registrar of Voters is welcoming different candidates, organizations, parties and members of the public to observe electoral processes. This election panel can take notice of upcoming events by viewing postings on our website [ocvote.com](http://ocvote.com) or through press releases specified by the media. All are welcome to this election panel. Registrar of Voters wants there to be a knowledge and contribution to these vital events prior, throughout, and following the General Election of November 2, 2010.

### **Upcoming events will include:**

Accuracy test of voting systems on October 26, 2010  
Ballot counts on Election Night, November 2, 2010

On Election Night those interested in coming to our office will be distributed a badge either with limited, moderate, or unlimited access. Depending on the type of badge received, different access points of our office will be permissible.

### **Guidelines to people observing at the poll sites and here at ROV:**

Signs will be posted at the polling places that tell you when you are within 100 feet of a polling place. The only signs you are allowed to post are those given to you by the Registrar of Voters office.

Poll monitors typically represent a candidate, party or organization and they have a right to be at a polling place. However, they may **ONLY** observe the procedures. They may not and should not, in any way, be involved with polling place operations and they may not interfere with operation of the polling place. They, too, may not remain if they interfere with or intimidate voters. If you believe that the presence or activity of a poll monitor may be intimidating voters, please call our office immediately.

Reporters, camera crews and other members of the media are allowed at the polling place as long as they respect voter privacy and do not interfere with the voting process. Taking pictures or recording footage of actual ballots is not allowed; the media is not allowed to disrupt activities at the polling place.

A political party, candidate or organization may appoint a poll monitor to observe activity at the polls and track voter turnout. Poll monitors can refer to the two posted copies of the Street Index if desired, but they may not interfere with or

intimidate voters. Notify the Registrar of Voters immediately if you believe that the presence or activity of a poll monitor may be intimidating voters.

Keep an eye out for activity that could indicate tampering or an attempt at tampering; immediately report to the Registrar of Voters any observations of tampering or an attempt to tamper with voting equipment. The Registrar of Voters will make the determination of whether the machine needs to be removed from service.
