On Thursday, September 17, 2020, the California Secretary of State's Office of Voting Systems Technology Assessment (OVSTA) received a request for Administrative Approval request from the County of Los Angeles to make code changes to the Voting Solutions for All People (VSAP) Interactive Sample Ballot (ISB) 1.2 and subsequent 2.5 remote accessible vote by mail system. The code change impacts party and office display name within contest choices.

California Elections Code section 19291 precludes a remote accessible vote by mail system that has been approved by the Secretary of State from being changed or modified until the Secretary of State has determined the change "does not impair its accuracy and efficiency...."

The changes to the VSAP ISB 2.5 remote accessible vote by mail system were tested and verified by our office. Additionally, we received and reviewed the change notes submitted with your application. The changes to the system do not impair its accuracy or efficiency pursuant to California Elections Code Section 19291.

Based on the application, change notes, and the testing performed, this Administrative Approval is granted for VSAP ISB 2.5. All other conditions of the VSAP ISB 1.2 remote accessible vote by mail system certification, dated January 29, 2020, remain in effect.
