Dear Ms. Parmer,

The California Secretary of State Office of Voting Systems Technology Assessment (OVSTA) received a request for administrative approval for one modification to the EVS 6.0.4.2 system pursuant to California Elections Code section 19216. The modification requested is as follows:

Upgrade the Expressvote Version 2.1 Complementary Metal Oxide Semiconductor (CMOS)
Battery from a Zeus Battery Products CR2032 battery to a CR123A battery via an adapter
assembly provided by Zeus Battery Products.

California Elections Code section 19216 precludes a voting system or part of a voting system that has been approved by the Secretary of State from being changed or modified until the Secretary of State has determined the change "does not impair its accuracy and efficiency...."

If the Secretary of State determines the change or modification does not impair the accuracy or efficiency of the voting system, the Secretary of State may administratively approve the proposed change or modification.

In addition, you submitted the following document from Pro V&V, an Election Assistance Commission certified Voting System Testing Laboratory:

ES&S ECO 1068 - Update V2.1 CMOS battery to extend time between maintenance events.

Based on the application and additional supporting documentation from Pro V&V, this administrative approval is granted. All other conditions of the EVS 6.0.4.2 certification, dated October 18, 2019, remain in effect.
